hristmas comes but once a year, and it's a busy season for printers and graphic designers. This has been true since the late 19th century, when society and commercial printing first boomed, and when type foundries first offered Christmas-themed cuts and ornaments to meet the demand.

Much of this material has been lost to time in successive technical revolutions in printing, and now exists only in foundry catalogs and scattered ephemera. It has been my goal to make these treasures accessible to modern graphic artists. To that end, I have gathered borders, ornaments, and a few appropriate typefaces from foundry catalogs and original lead type, German and American, dating from the 1890s to the 1920s. They range from fussy Victorian bits to Art Nouveau and Art Deco gems, none of them previously available in digital form. In preparing this design kit, I took great care to preserve my sources' authenticity while making them convenient to use in modern applications.

Many supporters have contributed to this project: Robert M. Schöne, Ilja Wanka, Ralf Herrmann, and Martin Z. Schröder were most generous in sharing their valuable source material and advice. To all of you I am exceedingly grateful.

Special thanks to my lovely and forbearing wife who suffered my constant whistling, humming, and singing of Christmas tunes all year long. I promise I'm done caroling!

It is both stately and playful, and well-suited for display work and limited quantities of body text. WF Orient Antiqua is a faithful restoration of the original. I have extended it to support most western European languages.




Schneekönigin FROZEN WEIHNFIEHTLICHES Blühwein Lebkuchen


Schneekönigin ("Snow Queen") was cast by Hoffmeister in Leipzig around 1909. It was still offered in 1925 by their successor, Stempel. I have extended this resurrection to support most western European languages. It includes all usual special characters, and a bespoke snowy border.

The separate "Snow" style allows you to apply color to the snow caps. (yellow not recommended).






With WF Liane, from the Art Nouveau Printshop design kit.






Color borders and ornaments come in two or three colors. The styles are called Regular, Color 2, and Color 3. These are used in layers to create polychrome results, as follows:




- 2. Duplicate your layout in place. For three colors, duplicate it again. You now have a stack of correctly aligned layers. Do not move them.
- 3. Change the font style for the second layer to "Color 2" and assign a color to it. Repeat for the third layer, if there is one.
- 4. Group the entire stack to prevent accidental misalignment.

You now have a polychrome border!












Note: monochrome and polychrome holly borders live in the same font!





With WF Neue Ohio Kraft from the Kraftwerk Press design kit.




With WF Neue Ohio Kraft from the Kraftwerk Press design kit. The outer border is a rectangle with stipple brush stroke applied.







